



St William's Hair and Jewellery Policy

(1) **Hair:** As general guidelines the following will need to be followed:

- (a) Natural colour in the hair (bleached/unnatural colour/streaks/foils/ tips are not acceptable)
- (b) No styles or cuts that draw undue attention (e.g. shaved heads, undercuts, tracks/lines, Mullets, patterns in the hair, hairstyles with significant contrasting sections and lengths) it is up to the *discretion of the leadership* to decide what is a breach of St William's hair style policy.
- (c) Gauge 3 is the shortest acceptable length.
- (d) Hair is to be off the collar and out of the eyes. If a student has to continually pull their hair back from their face or eyes it is too long.
- (e) Rat tails or any unnecessary lengthy extensions of the hair are not permitted.
- (f) Hair worn below shoulders must be tied back. Only white/navy/sky blue/navy & yellow hair ribbons or ties are acceptable.
 - a. The exceptions:
 - i. During House Swimming, Athletics and Cross-Country carnivals when the ribbons can be the colour of their sporting house.
 - ii. Special themed days ie "State of Origin, Daniel Morcombe Day, Say No to Bullying Day" etc. Clarity around these days and colours will be communicated to the community prior to these events.

Hair is to be neat and tidy. Hairstyle's that don't align with the intent of the St William's policy will need to be corrected. Students may be refused entry into classes until the matter is resolved.

- (1) **Jewellery.** The only jewellery allowed with the St William's school uniform is:
- a) fine neck chain with a small cross or religious medallion.
 - b) No rings or bracelets are to be worn (a medical alert bracelet is the exception).
 - c) A watch.
 - i. All smart watches need to be set to aeroplane mode while at school.
 - ii. Smart watches if used to take photos, make calls or send messages will need to be handed in at the start of the school day similar to using smartphones.
 - d) Earrings – 1 pair of small plain simple studs (max. 5mm in diameter) or sleepers (1mm or 2mm in diameter) in lower ear lobe only.
- (2) **Students are not permitted to wear make-up or nail polish.**

I would ask for parents' support in ensuring that students return to school in 2023 meet these guidelines.

- c) Ensure that uniform items are marked with the student's name.
